- UV Light Filters and fresh air vents
- Pre screening evaluation

Due to the fact that the covid-19 situation has been so fluid we wanted to let you know, as the outlook changes for the better we will be pivoting to offering other tours. Smaller Tour Groups

We design our escorted tours specifically for groups of 15 - 20, which allows us to visit unique locations and venues that groups of 30 or more simply could not consider. As well, we allow more room on the coach, ease of movement throughout the tour, and a more intimate experience. It is our understanding, after reviewing our tour Comment Cards, that a smaller group size more than compensates for a moderately higher tour cost.

Tour Activity Level

We use the walking symbol to reflect the approximate tour activity level of each tour, however if you have any concerns or questions, please inquire at the time of registration and our staff will be very happy to discuss the itinerary in more depth.

Each tour has specific physical requirements. Please pay close attention to the activity levels when booking to ensure an enjoyable, comfortable holiday.

EASY



This tour requires average physical activity.

MODERATE



You should be able to climb stairs and walk reasonable distances, possibly over uneven ground or inclines.

INTERMEDIATE



You must be able to walk a kilometre or more on uneven ground or extended inclines. In some cases must be able to handle extreme cold and high altitudes.

VERY ACTIVE



This tour is very active, requiring participants to be in good health and physically fit to enjoy all aspects of the tour. This itinerary will have more strenuous activities.

It is required that persons needing assistance be accompanied by a companion who is capable and totally responsible for providing that assistance as Ageless Adventures cannot provide special individual assistance to tour members with special needs.

An Ageless Adventures Peace of Mind Plan guarantees a full refund of all trip payments in the event of a cancellation, for any reason, up to 48 hours before the tour. This excludes the cost of the plan fee itself. During the course of a trip, if a passenger has to return home due to illness or a death in the immediate family, the plan fee guarantees a refund of any unused portion of the trip. (Not available on some tours)

The hotel/resort/lodge must possess several criteria. It must be a 3 1/2 star hotel rating or better, be centrally located, and have several amenities such as a pool and / or hot tub / sauna. The pricing will always include ocean and lake view rooms, if applicable.

Each Stay 'n' Play will have at least two sightseeing tours.

During free time there is always something offered as an option. From cultural activities to soft adventure and welcome receptions, to wine and cheese parties.

To the north an eerie, sulphurous sheen begins to ripple into the night sky. Its arcs itself into an ebb and flow, slowly growing, then suddenly bursts across the full expanse of the night sky waving and dancing as if it were happy. It is the spectacular northern lights and viewing is common in the Yukon. Northern Lights viewing takes place outside the city in a heated cozy cabin or wall tent. Hot drinks and snacks are provided. Other highlights include: a guided tour of Whitehorse, a visit to McBride Museum which houses information on the Klondike Gold Rush, Yukon Beringia Interpretive Centre, Yukon Wildlife Preserve, view the international Yukon Quest dog sledding race and an optional dog sled ride. Three Aurora Borealis viewing nights are included.

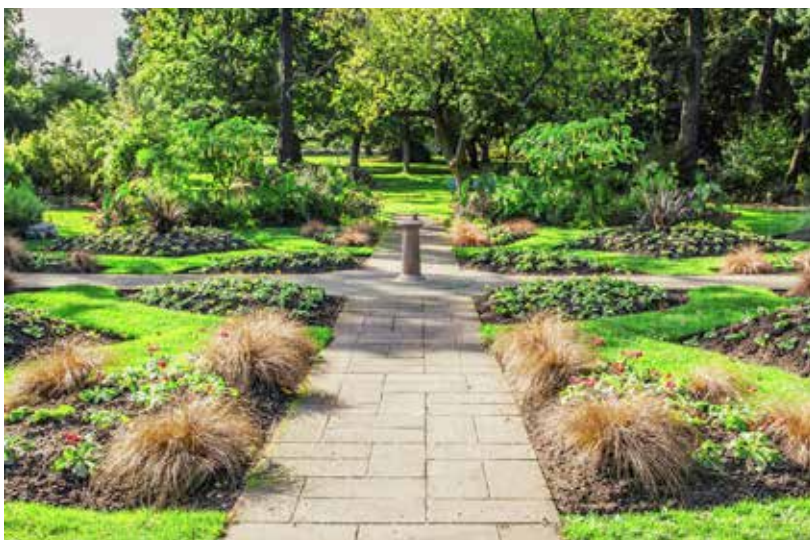

Vancouver – Halifax

Meals: D

Arrive in **Halifax** and check in to the **Halifax Hotel** for the night. This lovely hotel is ideally located in the downtown core.

Halifax – Sydney

Experience a two hour Iceberg tour, a true highlight, followed by a visit to the **Grenfell House**, the restored residence of Sir Wilfred Grenfell. Sir Wilfred was a young medical doctor who came to Newfoundland in 1892 and left behind a legacy of schools, orphanages, and medical services, which still exist today. The two night stay is in the town of **Cow Head**.

Day Ten:

Cow Head – Gros Morne National Park – Cow Head

After breakfast board the coach for a day of discovering **Gros Morne National Park**, a **UNESCO World Heritage Site**. The Park represents a 1,805 km² sample of Newfoundland's western highlands and coastal lowlands – a landscape of mountains, fjords, coastal bogs, and wave carved cliffs. Enjoy an included adventure boat tour through the heart of a fjord and an opportunity to get ceremonially "**screeched in**".



Day Eleven:

Cow Head – Gander

Day Twelve:

Gander – Twillingate – Clarenville

This morning we are off on the “**Road to the Isles**”, before travelling across “**Tickles and Runs**” to spend time at **Twillingate**. This is one of Newfoundland’s oldest and most interesting fishing communities. Visit Twillingate’s **Prime Berth Fishing Museum & Heritage Centre** and the **Twillingate Museum** with lunch at **Auk Island Winery**. Clarenville – Bonavista – St. John’s

Meals: B

Travel to **Bonavista**, the landfall of **John Cabot** in 1497. Here we visit the **Ryan Premises National Historic Site of Canada** and have an opportunity to learn about inshore fishing techniques that have allowed this town to thrive for hundreds of years. After the visit to Bonavista travel to **St. John’s**, the capital of Newfoundland, and our three night stay at the **Delta St. John’s Hotel**.

Day Fourteen:

St. John’s

Meals: B

After breakfast, depart from the hotel for a three hour city tour. The afternoon is free to explore downtown St. John’s on your own.

Day Fifteen:

St. John’s – Bay Bulls – St. John’s

Steaming lava fields and hot pools reflect its volcanic nature, while massive glaciers continue to sculpt the mountains and valleys, leaving thundering waterfalls and plunging fjords.

Day One:

Vancouver – Iceland

Departure from **Vancouver International Airport** with **Iceland Air** on a nonstop overnight flight to **Iceland**.

Day Two:

Keflavík – Reykjavík

An early arrival in **Keflavík International Airport** at 9:05 a.m., meet your local guide and travel by coach to **Reykjavík City**. Enjoy a boat ride around the islands and learn more about the this unique, beautiful site. Overnight in the **Westman Islands**.

Day Five:

The Golden Circle

Meals: B, D

Take the morning ferry back to the mainland and drive towards the first of the three most visited attractions in Iceland, collectively known as **The Golden Circle**. Starting with **Þingvellir**, where the North American and Eurasian tectonic plates meet, enjoy amazing landscapes. It too holds historical and cultural importance to Icelanders as it is where parliament was convened for almost 900 years. Next stop is the **Geysir geothermal area**, where the greatest attraction is **Strokkur**, a geyser that erupts 25m in the air every 8-10 minutes. Next up is the massive, two-levelled waterfall – **Gullfoss**. The wide **Hvítá River** rushes southward, and about a kilometre above the falls it turns sharply to the right and flows down into a wide curved three-step "staircase" and then abruptly plunges in two stages into a 32m crevice. The crevice is 20m wide, 2.5 km in length, and extends perpendicular to the flow of the river. It's great power is astonishing and one can walk right up to the waterfall in order to witness it from different angles. Afterwards, depart for two nights in the region of **Flúðir**.

Day Six:

Þjórsárdalur

Meals: B, D

Explore the lush fields and impressive mountains of **Þjórsárdalur Valley**. You'll be shown to the **Secret Lagoon** in **Flúðir** and swim in this beautiful geothermal pool (optional). Visit **Fríðheimar** to learn about the growing of tomatoes and tropical fruits in Icelandic greenhouses by use of geothermal energy and get to know the **Icelandic horses**.

Day Seven:

The South Coast of Iceland

Meals: B, D

Today travel east and explore the attractions of the **South Coast** of Iceland. Stop at **Seljalandsfoss Waterfall**, this waterfall is one of the most popular waterfalls and natural wonders in Iceland. The waterfall drops 60m and is part of the **Seljalands-River** that has its origin in the volcano glacier **Eyjafjallajökull**. One of the interesting things about this waterfall is the fact that visitors can walk behind it into a small cave. A few kilometers further are the tall **Skógafoss Waterfall**, the Skógafoss is one of the biggest waterfalls in the country with a width of 25m and a drop of 60m. Due to the amount of spray the waterfall consistently produces, a single or double rainbow is normally visible on sunny days. According to legend, the first Viking settler in the area, **Þrasi Þórólfsson**, buried a treasure in a cave behind the waterfall. Visit the **Skógar Museum** which commemorates the 2010 volcanic eruption of **Eyjafjallajökull volcano** and its implications in the area around. The two night stay is in the region of **Kirkjubæjarklaustur**, Icelandic for "church farm cloister".

Day Eight:

Skaftafell National Park and Jökulsárlón

Meals: B, D

Enjoy the beauty of **Skaftafell National Park**, which is formed over thousands of years by fire and ice. Take a cruise on the **Jökulsárlón Glacier Lagoon** and learn of its nature and history. The floating iceblocks in the light blue water are a sight to remember and if you're lucky you'll spot some lazy seals relaxing on the ice.

Day Nine:

Back to Reykjavík

Travel across the **Georgia Strait** to **Vancouver Island** with **BC Ferries**. Experience a leisurely day as we travel north to **Port McNeill**, your home for two nights. Dinner is included in the inn's restaurant.

View Pingos when visiting Tuktoyaktuk What is a Pingo?

Pingos are ice core hills that can only grow in a permafrost environment and can reach a height of 150 feet. Pingo is an Inuvialuit word for conical hill. A.E. Porsild (the scout for the Reindeer expedition) was first to suggest the scientific use of the word "pingo". There are an estimated 3,000 pingos in North America with some 1,500 found in the Mackenzie Delta – Tuktoyaktuk. The Inuvialuit & the Canadian Parks Service have recognized the significance of these unique landforms and designated the area a Pingo Canadian Landmark Site.

Day One:

Vancouver – Whitehorse

Meals: D

Your **Yukon Adventure** begins with a flight to **Whitehorse**, the capital city of **Yukon**. After collecting your luggage enjoy an informative visit to the **Beringia Interpretive Centre** and a stop at the **Visitor Centre** before checking in to the **Best Western Gold Rush Inn**. 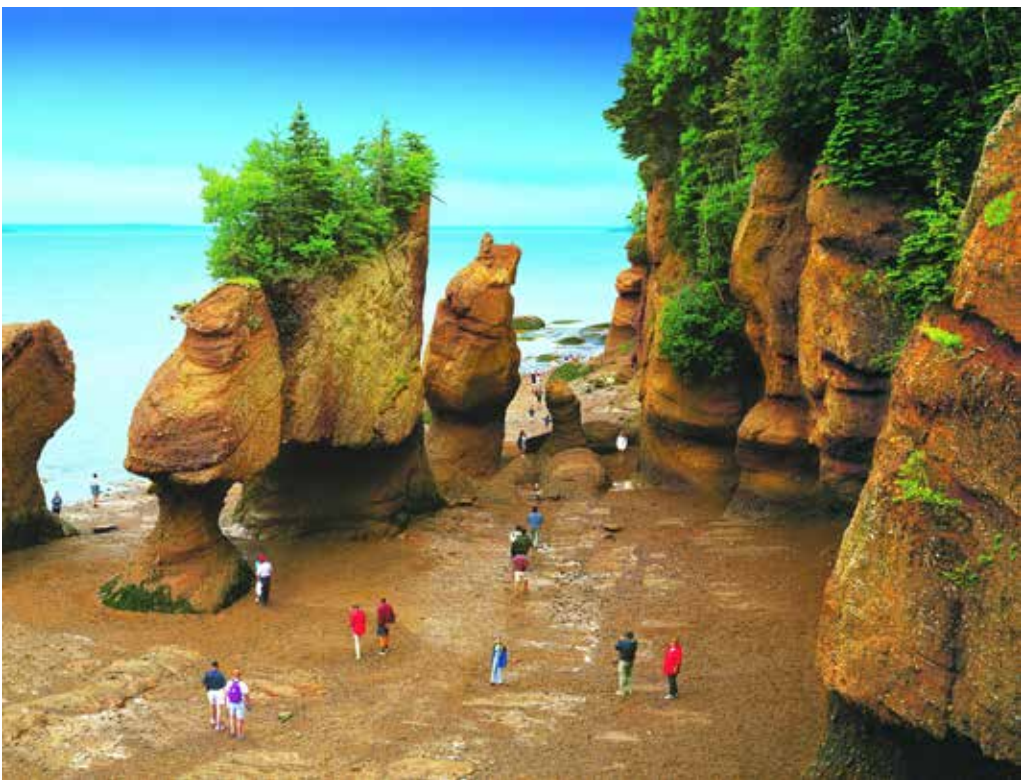

Join Ageless Adventures as we explore the St. Lawrence Seaway aboard the Canadian Empress which was launched in 1981. The year 1908 was chosen as a design and decor theme as it integrated well with the history of the St. Lawrence River. The ship is not a replica of any specific vessel but is a composite of many in the St. Lawrence region during the last century. She carries only 66 passengers in 32 cabins.

There are three decks on the ship. St. Lawrence Deck is the lowest and has most of the cabins and a gift shop. The Ottawa Deck has eight cabins, the Grand Saloon and Dining Room, and forward and aft outdoor sitting areas. The Sun Deck has lots of outdoor seating. Cabins have windows, two single beds, and a bathroom with a shower. Cabins are very compact compared to an ocean cruise ship. There is daily maid service. Nightly entertainment is included. The ship docks most nights in a community along the St. Lawrence River so you can go ashore at your leisure and explore the area.

Three meals a day plus afternoon tea and in-between treats are served in the Grand Saloon. There are usually two entrees offered with dinner. The menus utilize fresh, in-season, locally-produced fruits and vegetables, and bread may come from the pioneer ovens at upper Canada Village. Wine is included with lunch and dinner. Coffee and tea are available 24 hours a day.

Day One:

Vancouver – Toronto

Travel from Vancouver to **Toronto**. Overnight at the **Sheraton Gateway Hotel** located near the airport.

Day Two:

Toronto – Kingston – 1000 Islands

A miniature train takes the group to **Upper Canada Village** to meet horse-drawn wagon rides for the tour of the site. Founded in 1961, Upper Canada Village is one of the largest living-history sites in Canada. It depicts life in a rural English Canadian setting during the year 1866. Back onboard we cast off bound for **Coteau Landing, Quebec**. Near Cornwall, we enter the **Willey-Dondero Canal** for 15 km and the ship is lowered through the **Eisenhower** and **Snell Locks**.





Day Six: *Coteau Landing – Montreal*

Entire villages were relocated to higher ground, utilizing the largest moving and construction equipment in the world. As the temporary "coffer dams" were blown on July 1st, 1958, people watched with mixed emotions. Slowly rising water covered familiar land forever. It was sad for some to know they could never go home again. Others were excited to think of the new conveniences and services, modern schools, and new friends. A major highlight is the opportunity to pass through the locks between Kingston and Montreal, experiencing an overall change in water level of 246 feet.

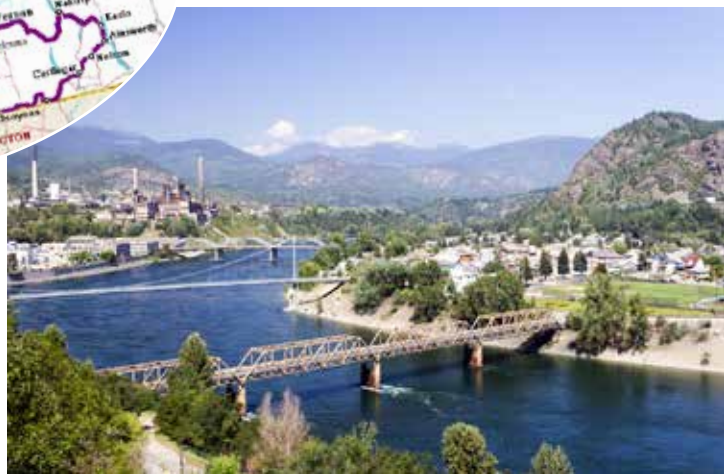
