#### Vancouver – Telegraph Cove

Board the morning ferry to Vancouver Island. Lunch is on your own in the quaint community of Qualicum. Follow the beautiful North Island Highway past Campbell River for a four night stay in the marine community of Telegraph Cove at the Telegraph Cove Resort.

#### Day Two: Telegraph Cove – Knight Inlet – Telegraph Cove Meals: B, L, D

Depart by boat for Knight Inlet located on the coastal mainland. View the grizzly bears in their natural surroundings in this spectacular inlet, as they interact and feed in the estuary and on the beaches near the river. The pristine beauty of the area enhances this rare opportunity to view these magnificent grizzlies. It is typical to find the bears chasing salmon around in the low tide pools at the river mouth.

#### Day Three: Telegraph Cove – Alert Bay – Telegraph Cove

Depart by ferry for Alert Bay and a guided tour of the U'mista Cultural Centre which houses one of the finest collections of historical artifacts and elaborately carved cedar masks depicting the Potlach Ceremony of the Kwakwaka'wakw People. Enjoy traditional dances and performances by the T'sasala Dance Group. This includes a lovely catered lunch.

#### **Day Four:**

#### Telegraph Cove

Telegraph Cove is a whale-watchers paradise. From the comfort of the 60-ft coast guard certified vessel this excursion takes the tour group into Johnstone Strait and Robson Bight to see killer whales in their natural habitat. Robson Bight is a world famous coastal area and ecological reserve for killer whales, also called Orca. Lunch is served at the Killer Whale Cafe.

#### **Day Five:**

#### Telegraph Cove – Vancouver

Meals: B Travel south to Courtenay with time for lunch and exploring on your own, before heading back the the lower mainland.
